### GARFIELD COUNTY REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS

#### 1. Purpose

Garfield County is requesting Statements of Qualifications (SOQs) from qualified engineering firms to provide planning, design, and construction-phase engineering services for watershed protection and flood mitigation projects under the NRCS Emergency Watershed Protection (EWP) Program. The County anticipates receiving NRCS EWP funding in response to damage caused by the France Canyon Fire (June–July 2025) and seeks to expedite project implementation due to the short funding timeline.

#### 2. Background

The France Canyon Fire burned approximately 35,159 acres, including significant portions of the Tropic Reservoir watershed. The burn area is characterized by highly erosive Claron Formation soils, steep slopes, and substantial vegetation loss. Post-fire modeling and field assessments indicate:

- Increased peak flows of 2–9 times pre-fire levels in critical drainages
- High sediment delivery potential to Tropic Reservoir and downstream infrastructure
- Debris flow likelihood of 60–80% in key watersheds
- Threats to hydrologic function, roads, and recreational facilities

The County's primary objectives are:

- 1. Protect Tropic Reservoir from excessive sedimentation.
- 2. Restore hydrologic function to the affected watersheds.
- 3. Implement flood control and erosion mitigation measures to protect infrastructure and public safety.

#### 3. Anticipated Scope of Work

Selected firms may be required to perform services including, but not limited to:

- Hydrologic and hydraulic modeling of post-fire watershed conditions
- Design of erosion control, sediment detention, and channel stabilization structures
- Road and culvert storm-proofing designs to handle increased runoff

- Cost estimating, construction plans, and bid documents
- Construction oversight and contract administration
- Coordination with NRCS, Garfield County, USFS, and other stakeholders

Projects must meet NRCS EWP program requirements for eligibility, cost-effectiveness, and environmental compliance.

#### 4. Submission Requirements

Interested firms should submit a Statement of Qualifications that includes:

Firm Profile: Name, address, contact information, size, and years in business.

Relevant Experience: Demonstrated expertise with NRCS EWP or similar watershed/flood control projects, particularly in post-wildfire conditions.

Key Personnel: Names, roles, and qualifications of staff who will work on the project.

Technical Approach: Brief description of how the firm would address the County's objectives and NRCS EWP requirements.

Project Management: Experience in delivering projects under tight deadlines and within federal funding constraints.

References: At least three references from similar projects.

#### 5. Evaluation Criteria & Scoring

Past Performance & References	Quality, timeliness, and cost control on past projects, as verified through references.	10
Local Knowledge	Familiarity with Garfield County, Tropic Reservoir watershed, and similar terrain/conditions.	10

The County will evaluate firms based on the criteria above. The highest-ranked firm will be invited to negotiate scope and fee once NRCS EWP funding is awarded. If no agreement is reached, the County will proceed to the next highest-ranked firm.
